University of Baltimore	 Maintain regular appointments Work with students one-on-one in the Legal Writing Center. Draft "Due Diligence" guides Assist Dean of Academic & Writing Support
University of North Carolina	 Both sets of student leaders work individually and in groups with 1Ls. Honors Writing Scholars (HWS) Each 1L LRW class has an Honors Writing Scholar assigned to it. 1Ls are required to meet with their HWS throughout the semester. Work with students on various assignments/exercises throughout the semester. Assignments/exercises may focus on citation and research. Don't comment or provide feedback on written assignments (i.e., client letters, memos, motions, etc.).
	 Enrichment Group Leaders Meet with 1Ls weekly. 1Ls volunteer to participate in the enrichment groups. Academic Enrichment Group Leaders focus on helping students in first-year casebook (podium) courses. The leaders are not considered Teaching Assistants. Academic Enrichment Group Leaders provide support such as advice on improving reading, reasoning, time management, note-taking, and exam-writing. Oral Argument Group Leaders help students learn how to handle their LRW oral argument with comfort and success. The oral argument groups supplement the regular LRW classroom instruction and preparation on oral arguments.

Attend class to help supervise in-class activities, facilitate small-group discussions, etc. Meet with students who fail to meet minimum standard on ungraded assignments/checkpoints. (sometimes) review/comment on ungraded work. (when staffing permits) Plan and conduct lunchtime workshops on research, citations, etc.
Howard	 Work with students one-on-one in the Legal Writing Center and in their assigned Sections The Dean's Fellows not attached to the Writing Center will help their assignment professors with assignments, teach citation classes, and hold office hours with the students in their section Conduct workshops for 1Ls-3Ls (3+ per/semester) over the lunch hour
