General Background:

I am an Associate Professor of Law at Elon University School of Law, where I teach Legal Method & Communication, Elon's year-long legal writing course, along with international law courses. Prior to joining academia, I clerked for the Honorable Judge Carl J. Barbier on the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Louisiana and practiced for several years for a general civil defense firm in New Orleans. My research lies predominantly in international criminal law and transitional justice, with a focus on the international prosecution of mass atrocities before international courts and the use of transitional justice mechanisms in post-conflict and settler colonial societies. I am a former Fulbright Scholar, having spent the 2022-2023 academic year on a Fulbright research grant in Gothenburg, Sweden. I am also a published novelist; my debut thriller THE RESORT was recently published by Sourcebooks and an imprint of Penguin Random House.
